What's Needed: 6 Pieces Construction Paper 3-5 Packages Flower Seeds Food Processor Scissors Water



1. Cut paper into 1-inch squares and put them into a small dish, keeping each paper color in its own dish.

2. Fill each dish with water just until the paper is covered. Soak for about 20 minutes.

3. Take one of the bowls of paper and wring it out about halfway. Put it in the food processor and pulse the paper into a pulp. Repeat this with all the paper colors and put the pulp back into each bowl.

4. Sprinkle some seeds into each bowl of paper, mix them in a little, and press the pulp and seeds into balls. If the pulp is a little dry, put a few sprinkles of water on the pulp. It will help it to hold its shape better.

5. Set the seed balls on a sheet pan to dry overnight. Plant in your garden or anywhere you want flowers to grow.

Descriptions of Professional Development Sessions

An Overview on the Importance of Child Observation and Assessment

Participants will receive an overview of child observation and assessment along with information on why we observe children, the different observation types, screenings, assessments, benefits, and tools needed to perform the observation and assessments.

Biting: Finding the WHY and How to Help

This session takes a look into possible prevention and reasons for biting. We will talk about documentation, communication, and the first tier of the pyramid model.

Director's Toolbox 🛛 🕅

The Director's Toolbox is a 7-week module series that is intended solely for administrators in a child care center or facility. This program is designed to improve the quality of early care and education for children in West Virginia. Director's Toolbox is worth 14 hours of WV STARS credit.

ECERS-3 Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale-3

This session will go through and discuss each section of the assessment, scoring, and the importance of using this rating scale. Participants will be given the opportunity to take part in activities to help them better understand what to look for when using this tool.

Emergency Preparedness 🌋

In this two-hour training session, participants will discuss the different types of emergencies that could happen, learn the importance of planning and preparing for those emergencies, and how to protect children and staff during and after events. Participants will receive support in creating the required emergency preparedness action plan. *There is a 1-hour TA required to receive full credit.*

Emotional Literacy: What's the Big Deal About Feelings Anyway?

Understanding emotional literacy can help a person in multiple ways. In this session, we will be looking closely at the importance of emotions. We will discuss different perspectives, development, and strategies that could help with big emotions happening with not only the children, but caregivers as well. By taking this session, it will help you understand that all emotions are valid and how emotions are another way of communicating.

From Milestones to Stepping Stones: Knowing is Half the Battle!

This session will give participants a better understanding of what child development is and the milestones within. We will discuss the importance, different ways, and benefits of tracking these milestones, because understanding where children should be developmentally will only benefit both you and the parents.

Inspiring Spaces=Learning Places

When children walk into your classroom, what do they see? Is the space inviting, warm, clean, fun and wellorganized or cluttered, dirty and chaotic? This session will help you see the importance of making your classroom an inspiring space full of wonder, excitement, and engaging learning opportunities!

Let's Take a Time Out from Time Out: Using Other Strategies to Help Possibly Lessen Behaviors

This session takes a look into how time out originated, licensing requirements, the social emotional aspects, and how relationships are impacted. In addition, we will look at other strategies that may help lessen the behaviors in the classroom.

Descriptions of Professional Development Sessions

"No, Stop, Be Careful!" Why Children Need Risky Play

Simply saying the words risky play can make some people nervous. However, risky play is something children are designed to do. When children can take part in risky play, they may experience new emotions, self-awareness, and even learn about consent. Children can practice decision-making and problem-solving skills, in addition to learning how their bodies work within the world. In this session, we will review the purpose, the benefits, and the different types of risky play. We will also discuss ways of becoming more comfortable with the concept and how we are likely already taking risks every day!

Planning Your Professional Growth 🕅

This training focuses on professional growth of early education providers and how to identify goals for the future.

Play: What Is It Good For?

Play is essential for the growth and development of infants and toddlers. Caregivers will explore ideas of how to support and facilitate play while learning how play is essential to the growth and development of infant and toddlers.

Quality Environments 101

This training will introduce family childcare providers to the Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale (FCCERS). The training will discuss how the FCCERS is used in classrooms, why the FCCERS is important, and how the FCCERS relates to the Tiered Reimbursement Program in WV. Family childcare providers will get a basic understanding for the FCCERS and be presented with an opportunity for further training in this area.

Teamwork: Let's Work Together

This session will discuss teamwork at work, why it is important, what a good team member may be, and how to go from being a good team member to being great. It will also get colleagues interacting with one another while having them work together as a team. In doing so they will learn some things about their co-workers they may not have known prior to this session.

The 5 W's for Lesson Planning

This training will focus on lesson planning. We will discuss what a lesson plan is, the planning process, who is involved in that process, and the information that needs to be included on a lesson plan. This training will also look at the differences between an individualized plan and a group plan.

The Importance of Developmentally Appropriate Practice

This session will allow participants to gain a better understanding of developmentally appropriate practice. Participants will be given information on the 12 Principles of Child Development & Learning, 5 Guidelines for Effective Teaching, 10 Effective DAP Teaching Strategies, and what DAP looks like for each age group.



A Painted Branch: Collaborative Art with Kids

- 1. Place a branch on the art table with paints and brushes, pom poms, and glue.
- No instructions, no rules besides: don't splatter paint on other people's work on purpose. Share the supplies and be kind.
- 3. Once all children who wish to contribute have done so, allow it to dry and then display in your room for all to enjoy!

Descriptions of Professional Development Sessions

Self-Care: What Does it All Mean?!

Self-care. It's the new cure all buzzword, right? We've all heard about it and for the most part we know that it sounds important. We probably have heard some things that we "should" do. As natural caregivers, we often find ourselves just giving to others all day long, both at work and at home. How are we supposed to have time to take time for ourselves? In this session, we will discuss the meaning of self-care, different types of stress, the difference between unhealthy coping behaviors and self-care, and that self-care is <u>NOT</u> selfish.

Understanding ACES: ACES 101 🌋

During this one-hour training session participants will be introduced to the concept of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) through awareness and education. Participants will understand what ACEs are and the impact it has on children and adults, become familiar with the 10 types of ACEs, and gain an understanding of ways to overcome ACEs.

Utilizing the Environment Rating Scale to Achieve Higher Program Quality

This session will include an overview of the most recent versions of the Environment Rating Scales as well as information on how to use the results from the self-assessment to improve program quality through goal setting and the creation of action plans and professional development plans. This training will be applicable to staff and administrators of childcare centers, facilities, and family child care home programs.

Visual Aids: The What, the Why, and the How

This session will go over the value of visual aids. Visual aids not only support creating a more inclusive classroom, but also help by having a permanent, concrete reminder to your words. We will discuss the components and different types of visual aids, and how to implement helpful, positive visual aids within your classroom setting.

West Virginia Early Learning Standards Framework: Infant/Toddler (WV ELSF)

In this module series, providers will explore and become familiar with the Early Learning Standards Framework: Infant/Toddler. Emphasis will be on using the ELSF I/T to complete individualized lesson plans for infants and toddlers. Providers will leave the course with a completed example of an individualized lesson plan.

WV Early Learning Standards Framework (WV ELSF) Overview 💥

This session provides an overview of the purpose, content, and benefits of standards in everyday life, early learning standards and the WV Early Learning Standards Framework (WV ELSF). It also lays the groundwork for specific age group implementation for use in early childhood settings.

West Virginia Elements of Family Child Care Series (WV EFCCS)

This seven-part series, presented in 4-hour sessions, will provide a comprehensive overview of The Creative Curriculum for Family Child Care and how to use The Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale-Revised."

WVIT II: Relationship Based Care 🌋

West Virginia Infant Toddler Professional Development Program II provides information about relationships with Infants and Toddlers. 10-week course. Must be WV STARS registered and have previously completed WVIT.

Provide a variety of tools such as tongs, muffin tins, spoons and magnifying glasses to encourage children to sort, measure, count, arrange, and explore.





Springtime Fun

Now that the long, cold winter is over, it's time to get outdoors and explore in the warm sun of Spring! Need some ideas on how to get the kiddos back in action after the winter hibernation? The following are some suggestions for activities for the kids and families in your care:

1. Make your own bubbles. Bubbles are always a hit! What's better than just blowing bubbles? Making them yourself! Here's an easy, DIY recipe to make your own:

- •Pour 1 cup of water into a jar or bowl.
- •Add 1 tablespoon of dish liquid.
- •Add 1 tablespoon of glycerin.

•Stir all ingredients together.

If bubbles don't form well, add more soap and/or glycerin.

- 2.Grow a vegetable garden. Let the children help you decide which vegetables to grow. Take them to the plant center to pick them out. The children can take part in the planting process, as well as the day-to-day care for the plants. Allowing the children to have a part in this process encourages them to try more vegetables. Once you have harvested them, look up some fun and yummy recipes to feature your homegrown veggies!
- 3.Take a nature walk and have a scavenger hunt. Discuss what's different in the spring from the rest of the year and seasons. Make a list of specific spring items for them to find along the way. Turn it into a competition to see who can find the most springtime items on the list!
